GENERAL INFO

Kata: Competition will begin at 8:30 with Nage no Kata, followed by Katame no Kata and Ju no Kata

Shiai: Junior competition will begin at 10:00, Seniors and Veterans competition will begin upon completion of the Juniors competition

Tournament Meeting: Officials, coaches and managers Saturday 9:30 am - 10:00 am at tournament site.

Head Referee: Joan Miller-PJC

Referee Certification: NW Class "R" certification available by the NWYDK Certification Committee.



TOURNAMENT RULES

Current IJF rules with the following safety modifications will govern:

- 1. Shime waza (choking) and will not be allowed for age divisions 12 years and below.
- 2. Kansetsu waza (arm locks) will be allowed for cadets and all senior divisions
- 3. Pre-2003 medical rules will apply to all Junior Divisions.
- 4. Current IJF medical rules will apply to all Senior Division
- 5. Blue gi and white gi are required for all divisions. A blue gi may be worn only when the contestant's name is called second . Some blue gi will be available for sale and for loan. Blues gi wil be available on site.
- 6. There will be Co-ed competition for juniors 6-8 years old.
- 7. The outside boundary shall be 3 meters for this event with 4 meters between the mats with an 8 meter competition area.

SHIAI FORMAT

- Divisions with 6 or more competitors will use a modified double elimination bracket, the champion will not have a loss
- Divisions with 5 or less competitors will use a pool bracket.
- Changes in the above may be made at the discretion of the Tournament committee.
- No competitor may move down an age group.
- First, second and third place will be awarded to the Divisions indicated below.

KATA COMPETITION FORMAT

- All competition will be in one division. Eligible teams include all female, all male and mixed pairs (all competing in the same division).
- Teams may compete in one or more kata, though an individual may only compete in each kata once.
- Changes in the above may be made at the discretion of the Tournament committee. First, second, and third places will be awarded.



AGE & WEIGHT DIVISIONS

Bantum (8 and under)

Veterans (35 vrs+)

Intermediate 1 (9 and 10)

Light, Middle, & Heavy

If a player moves up to a division by their own choice they will be subject to the rules for that division. If a player is placed for size in a division with rules not pertaining to his division, he will be marked and subject only to the rules pertaining to his age or rank division.

Actual weight divisions will be based on available competitors. Every attempt will be made to ensure fair competition for all competitors.

The word, "Taiko" in Japanese literally means great or wide drum. It refers most commonly to a distinctive form of drumming that has its roots in ancient Japanese culture. But Taiko also describes the art form of modern Japanese drum ensembles, as well as the physical drums used by these groups.

About en Taiko

The "en" in "en Taiko" is probably best translated as "happenstance," as in the lucky bits of circumstance that bring people together. Even in ancient Japan, Taiko was not just a musical instrument. 
